

Frequency Coordination Meeting: July 16, 2011

We had about 30 attendees.

Announcements:

- Anyone wanting a copy of their current coordination may do so by giving the coordinator or chairman a card or note with the call and freq.
- Repeater listings are available by band on the coordination web page. We are working on the problem with the combined listing.
- Occasionally a coordination for a frequency that appears available may be denied due to it not being in the best interest of spectrum usage. This will occur more frequently in areas where there is a shortage of available pairs.
- Equipment that is not placed on the air within 90 days of coordination may have the coordination set aside unless prior arrangements have been made.
- Application must be submitted to: coordinators @ azfreqcoord.org
- We do not require a copy of your site agreement for coordination. A letter from the site stating you have permission to install owner will do fine.
- We are running out of D-Star (narrow band) frequencies. Since packet frequencies are very underused, we are looking at possibly reallocating a couple of those.
- There was a lengthy discussion about two repeaters that had been decoordinates in the Bullhead/Kingman area. The coordination was invalidated when the repeaters were moved, per policy. The parties involved were advised that they should submit applications for the new locations.
- The Chairman was given a unanimous vote of confidence, so will continue for another year.
